NET © It is not rude, it is not self-serving, it is not easily angered or resentful.

NIV © It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs.

NASB does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account
© a wrong *suffered*,

NLT © or rude. Love does not demand its own way. Love is not irritable, and it keeps no record of when it has been wronged.

MSG © Doesn't force itself on others, Isn't always "me first," Doesn't fly off the handle, Doesn't keep score of the sins of others,

BBE © Love's ways are ever fair, it takes no thought for itself; it is not quickly made angry, it takes no account of evil;

NRSV or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful;

NKJV does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil;

1) Vs. 5a It is not rude (aschmonei),

Pronunciation: as-kay-mon-eh'-o

To act unbecomingly

2) Vs. 5b ...it is not self-seeking (zeteo),

Pronunciation: dzay-teh'-o

- 1) to seek in order to find
 - 1a) to seek a thing
 - 1b) to seek [in order to find out] by thinking, meditating, reasoning, to enquire into
 - 1c) to seek after, seek for, aim at, strive after
 - 2) to seek i.e. require, demand
 - 2a) to crave, demand something from someone

3) Vs. 5c ...it is not easily angered (paroxuno),

Pronunciation: par-ox-oo'-no

- 1) to make sharp, sharpen
 - 1a) to stimulate, spur on, urge
 - 1b) to irritate, provoke, arouse to anger
 - 1b1) to scorn, despise
 - 1b2) provoke, make angry
 - 1b3) to exasperate, to burn with anger

4) Vs. 5d ...it keeps (logizomai) no record of wrongs (kakos).

Pronunciation: log-id'-zom-ahee

- 1) to reckon, count, compute, calculate, count over
 - 1a) to take into account, to make an account of
 - 1a1) metaph. to pass to one's account, to impute
 - 1a2) a thing is reckoned as or to be something, i.e. as availing for or equivalent to something, as having the like force and weight
 - 1b) to number among, reckon with
 - 1c) to reckon or account
 - 2) to reckon inward, count up or weigh the reasons, to deliberate
 - 3) by reckoning up all the reasons, to gather or infer
 - 3a) to consider, take into account, weigh, meditate on
 - 3b) to suppose, deem, judge
 - 3c) to determine, purpose, decide
- ++++ This word deals with reality. If I "logizomai" or reckon that my bank book has \$25 in it, it has \$25 in it. Otherwise I am deceiving myself. This word refers to facts not suppositions.

Pronunciation: kak-os'

 - 2) of a mode of thinking, feeling, acting
 - 2a) base, wrong, wicked
 - 3) troublesome, injurious, pernicious, destructive, baneful
